Parliamentarians and the SDGs: Nigeria

- Participation by Christina Ude SDG consultant at National Assembly of Federal Republic.
- "How the nexus approach would be a useful tool for advancing the environmental dimensions of the 2030 agenda in Nigeria."
- Tools: <u>Guide for Parliamentary Engagement in implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the SDGs</u> by UN SDG Action Campaign and <u>Parliaments and the SDGs</u> by IPU and UNDP.

UN-NGO Committee on Migration Subcommittee on Climate Induced Displacement

- Bringing a climate perspective to migration meetings and a migration perspective to climate meetings in UN fora.
- Working for the inclusion of grassroots voices in UN conversations on the subject and its nexus to poverty and unemployment, food, housing, energy, and water insecurity; cultural, identity, sovereignty, and governance concerns.
- Examples: <u>Nansen Initiative</u> by Switzerland and Norway. <u>Advisory Group on Climate Change and</u> <u>Human Mobility</u> UN System

UN SDG Fund

- UN development cooperation mechanism that implements the SDGs through its partnerships between UN agencies, national governments, academia, civil society and private sector.
- Collaboration on joint programmes have led to broad and more inclusive programs that combine inputs and expertise from non-traditional actors.
- Examples: Food security and nutrition programme promoting the use of solar energy in the food production in Bolivia. Providing training opportunities on green construction using traditional techniques and materials in Mozambique.



FAO AquaCrop

- Crop-water productivity model developed by FAO's Land and Water Division to address food security and assess the effect of the environment and management on crop production.
- AquaCrop simulates the yield response of herbaceous crops to water.
- Well suited to conditions in which water is a key limiting factor in crop production.



3% Project: Canada

- 5 national tours across Canada to engage one million youth in 700 high schools – that's about 3% of Canada and 1 in 5 high schools in the country.
- Sustainability problem-solving skills to make it a core competency of our generation, including the nexus methodology.
- Focusing on Climate and its linkages with all 17
 SDGs with a special focus on education and technology.

2020 or Bust Mobile App

- Based on the UN Environment Emissions Gap Report, 2020 or bust is an innovative campaign "awakening, enabling and empowering individuals to end the climate crisis."
- In order to foster climate action, users are prompted to choose to lower their carbon footprint by taking tangible actions within 5 overarching areas: transportation, tree planting, energy efficiency and renewable energy and sustainable consumption.
- Collective and individual carbon emission reductions are tracked aiming to "reverse the current emissions trend sufficiently to get us on track to a sustainable future."
