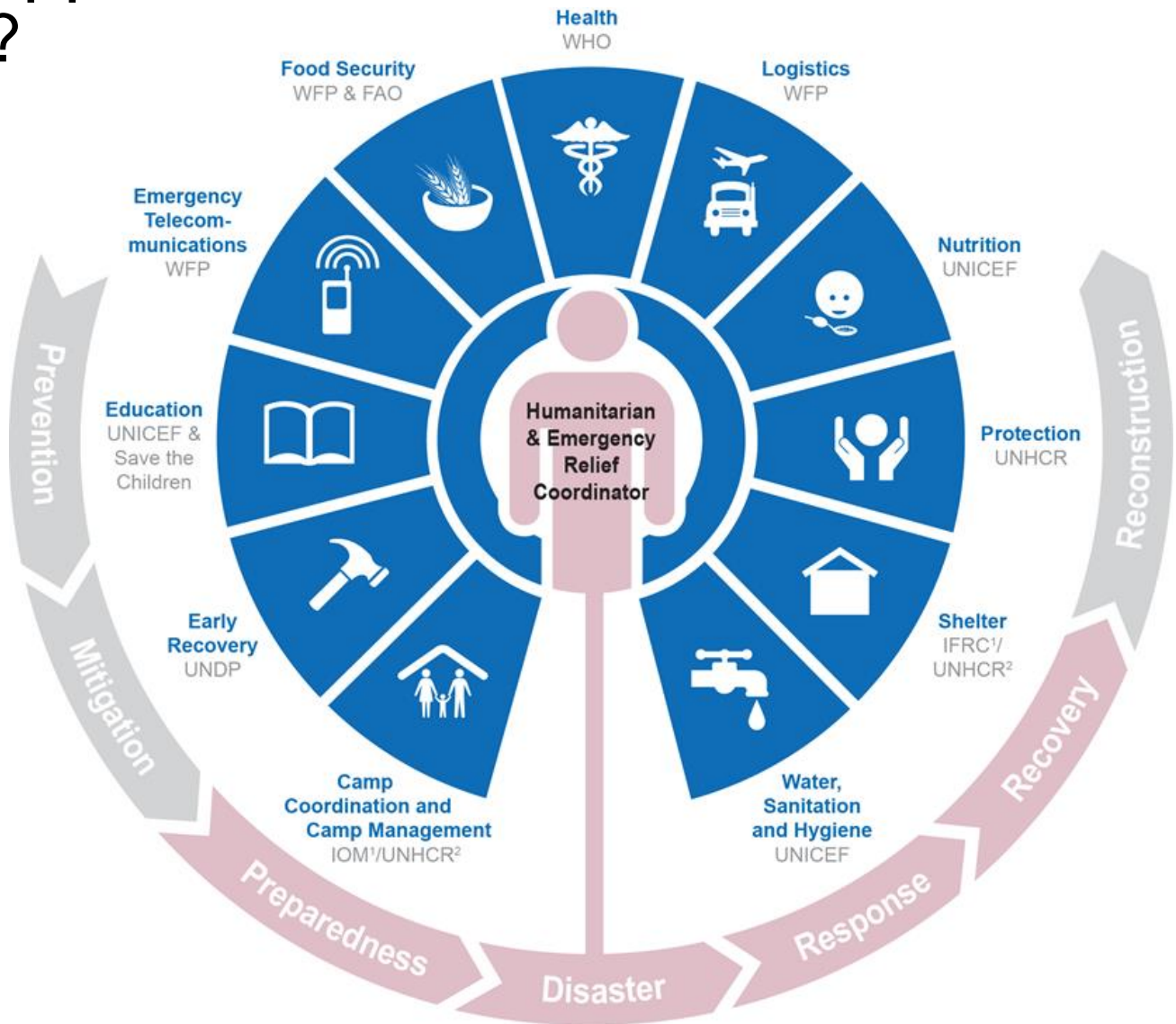

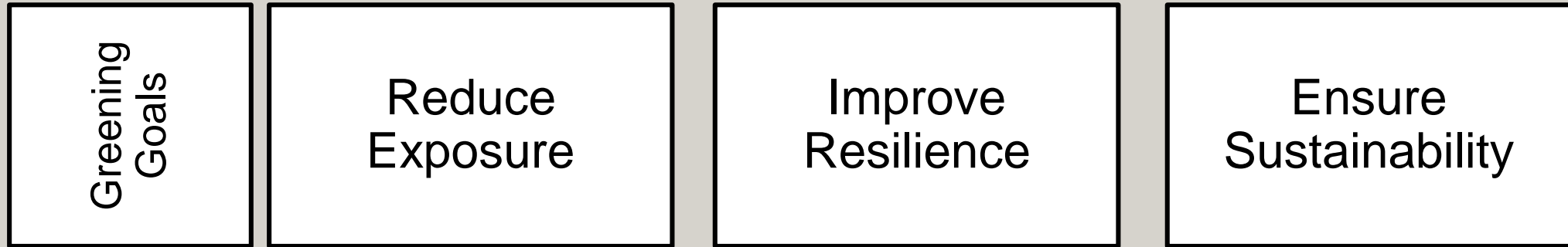

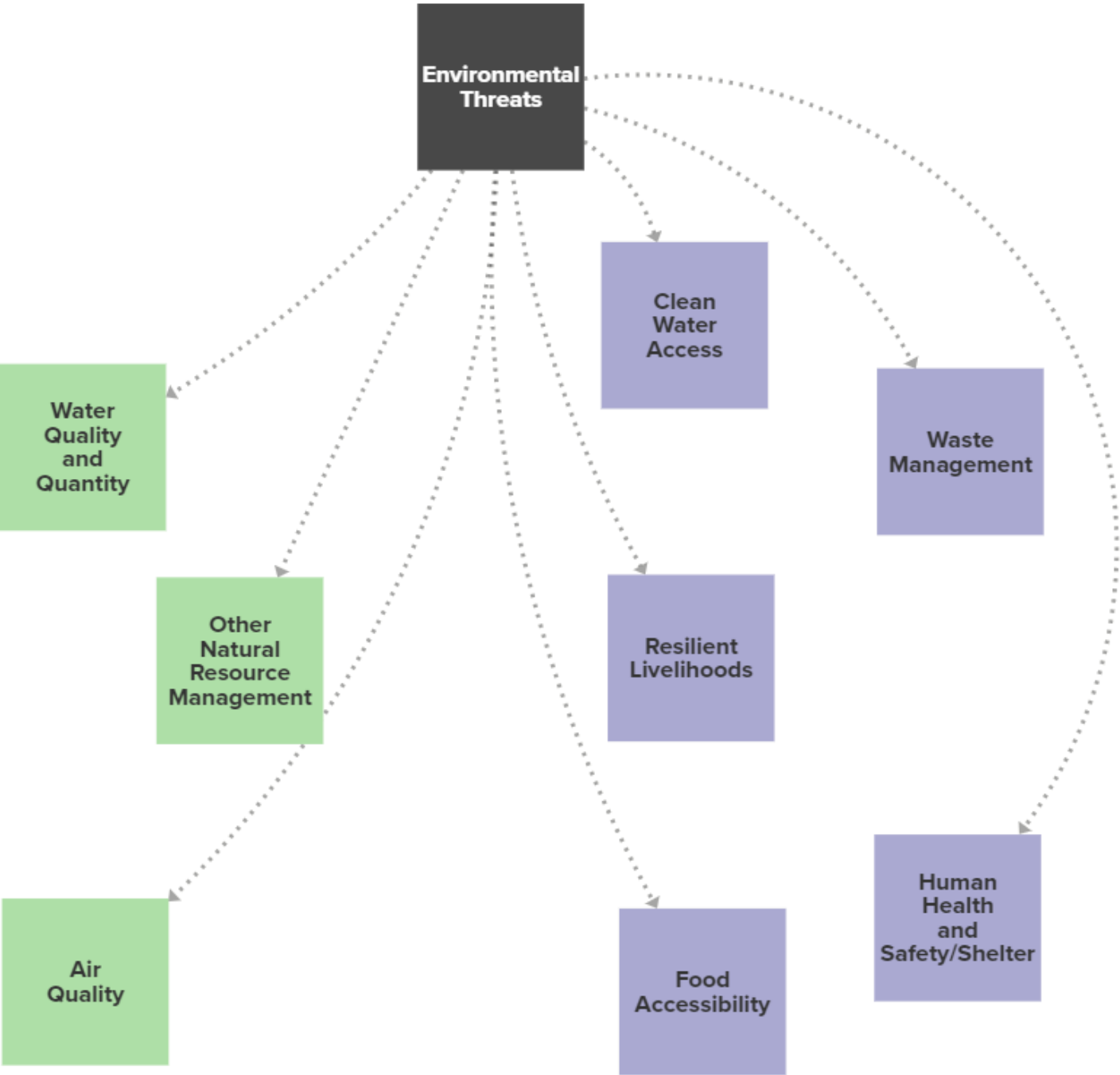

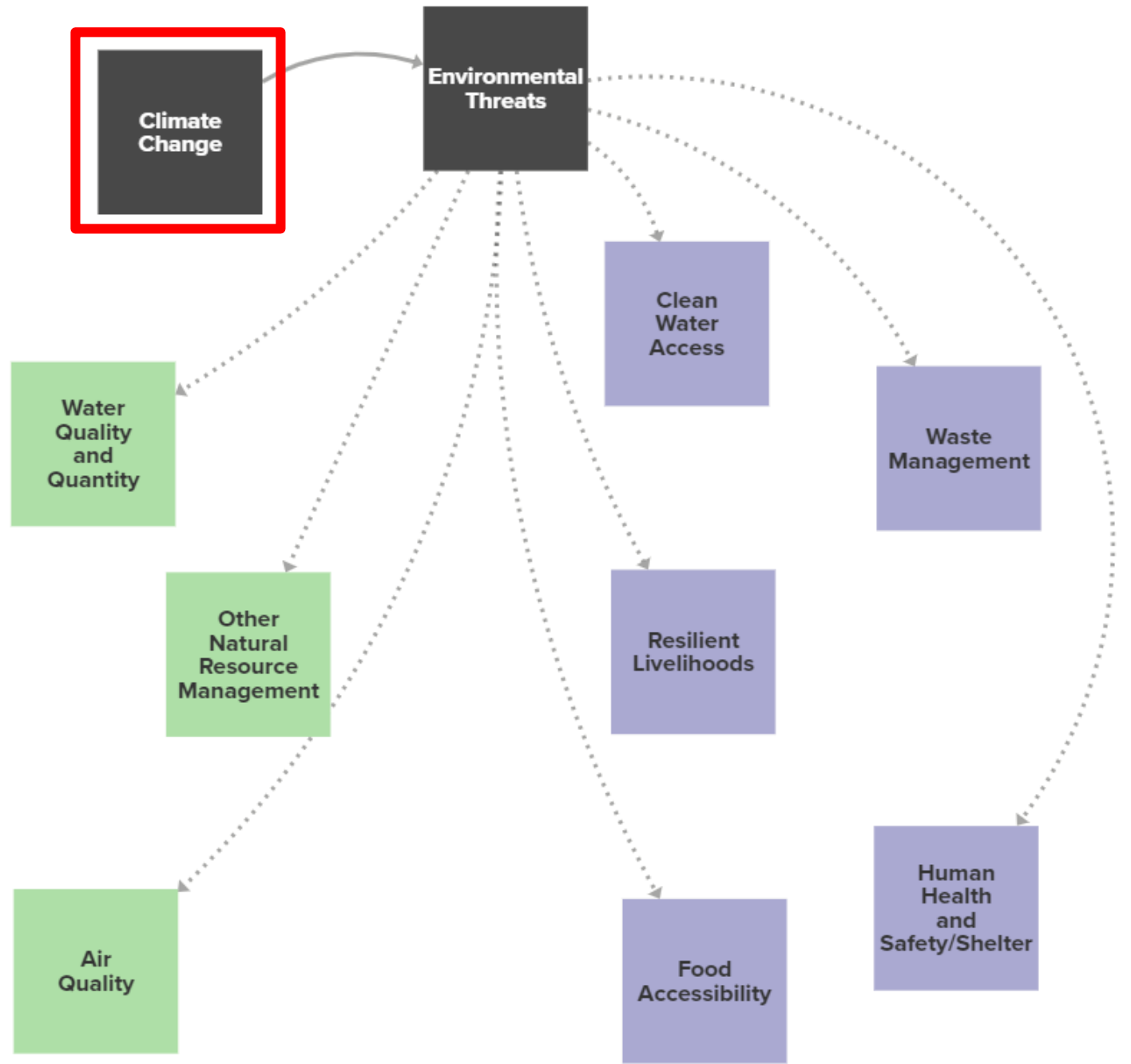
Environmental threats negatively impact both sector interests

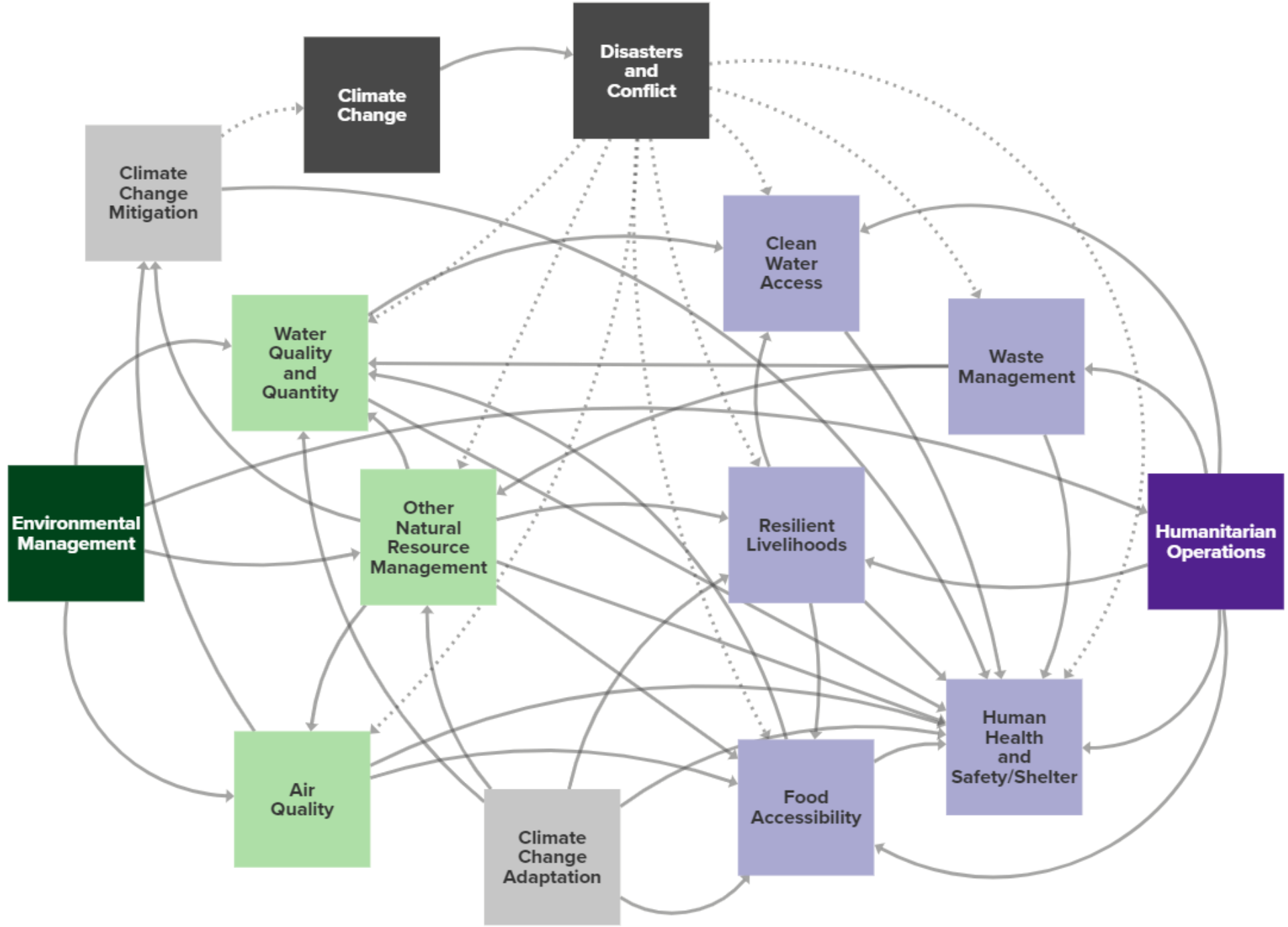


Important to green humanitarian operations as there is potential for **cyclical threat multiplier** if interests cannot be achieved

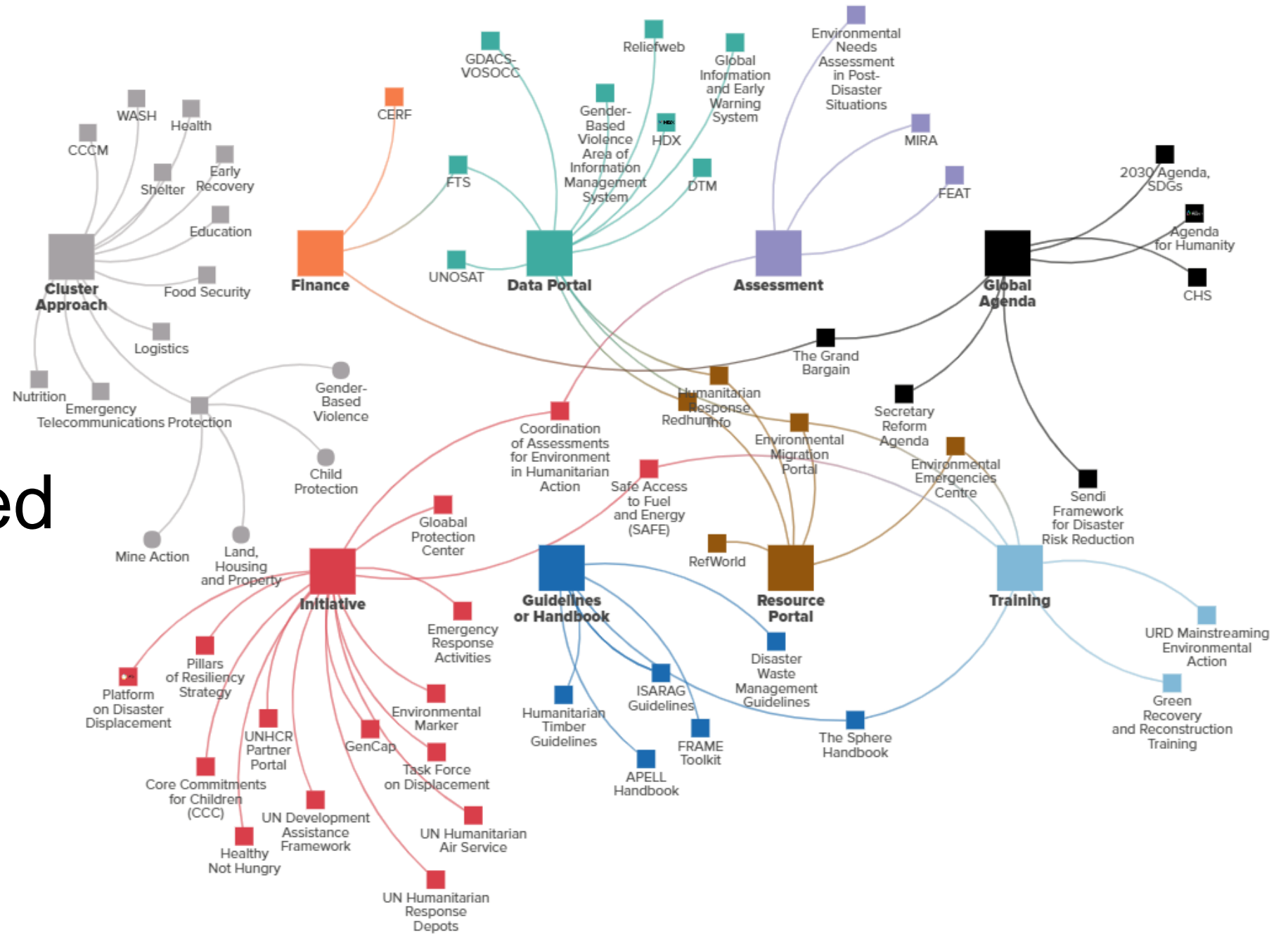

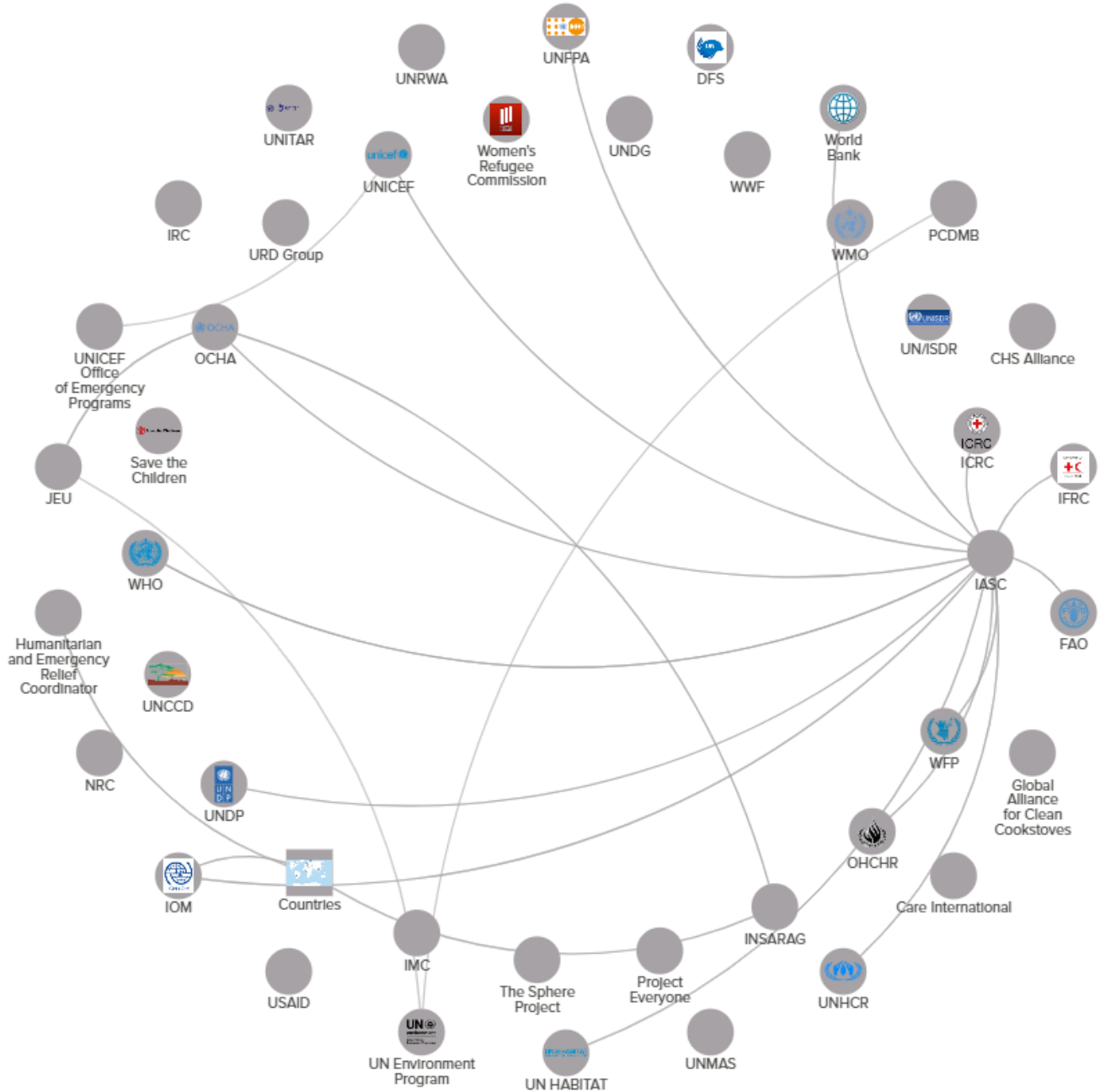

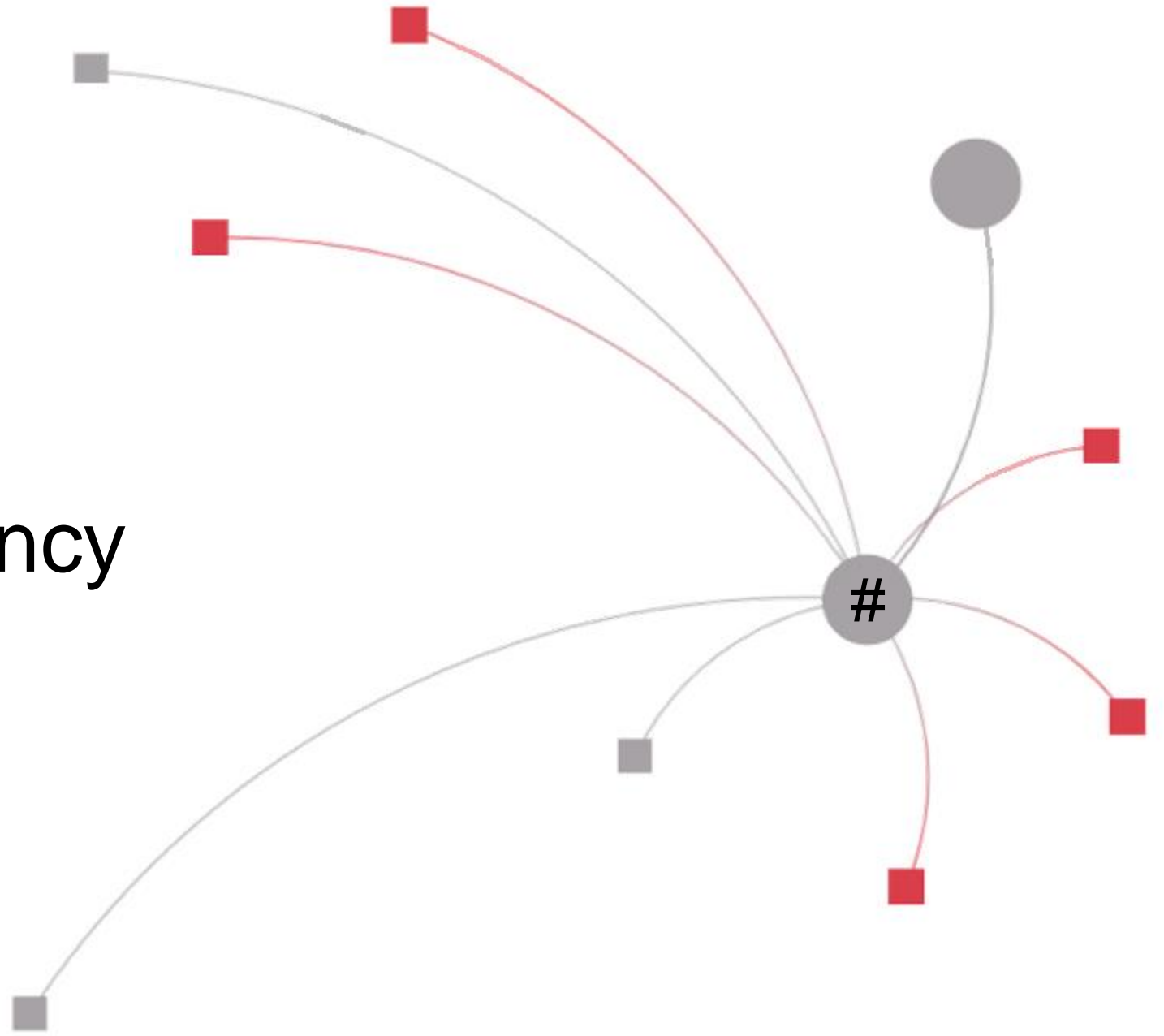
Types of Resources Represented



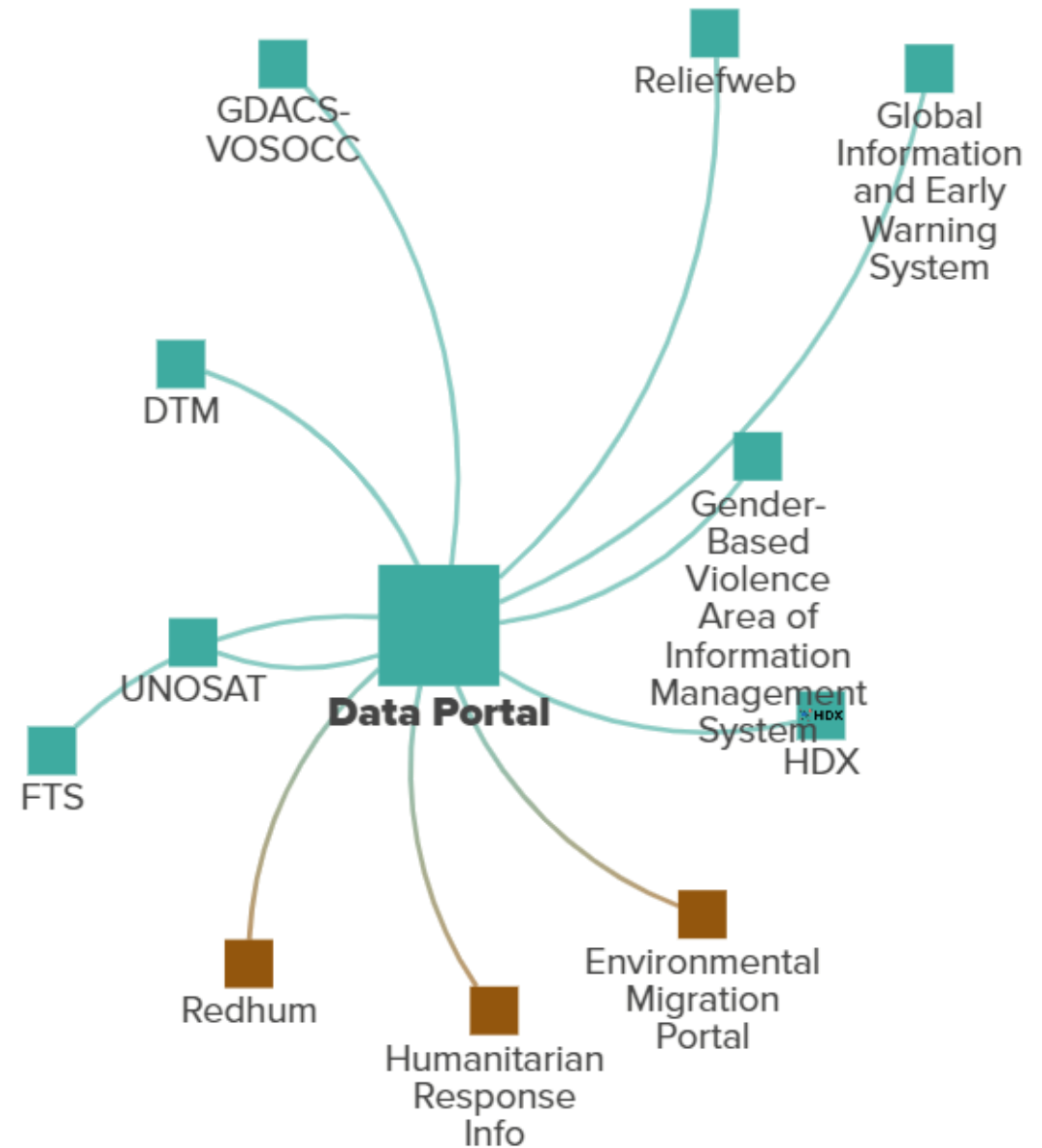
