

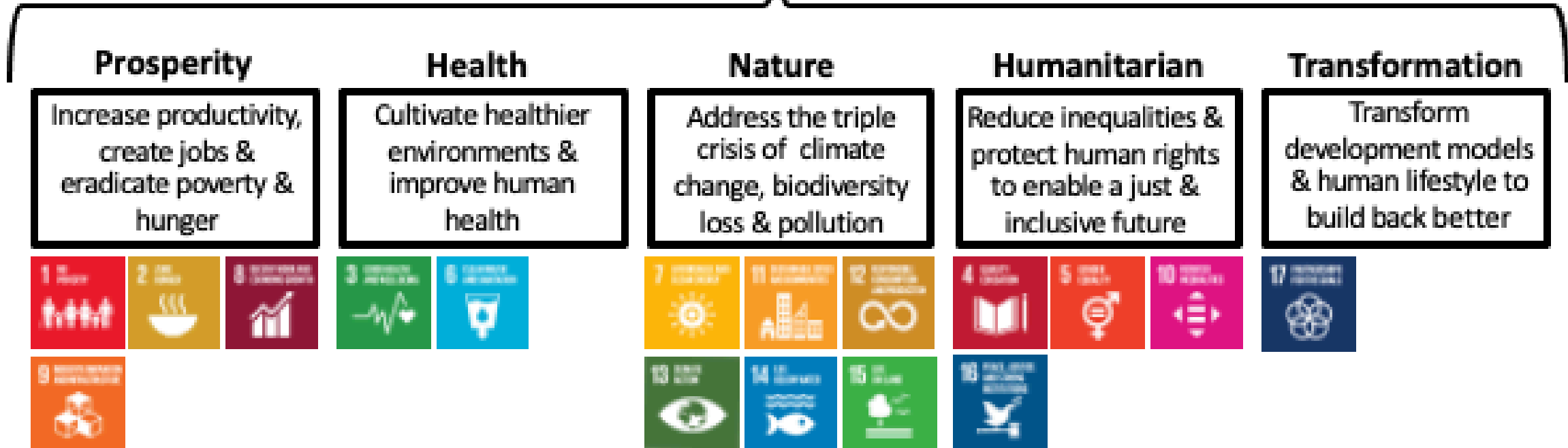

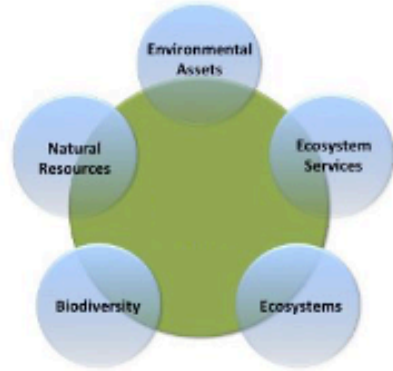

Completed Tasks

- Kick-off meeting in March
- Terms of Reference for the consultative process was finalised and approved.
- Two surveys have been completed to collect information from the UN agencies on: why green recovery is needed, how green recovery must be defined/implemented, how the UN system is helping, and how the efforts by the UN agencies can be better coordinated and integrated.
- The draft green recovery narrative has been completed.

Ongoing/Next Tasks

- Feedback collection on the green recovery narrative and finalization of the narrative
- Data collection, surveys, and interviews to map the UN agencies' programs, initiatives, guidance documents and other tools on COVID-19 response and recovery.
- Finalizing the report on the gaps and opportunities for UN-wide collaboration in green recovery based on the feedback from different stakeholder groups and reviewing the current state of interactions between them.
