Environment Management Group work plan 2022- 2023

Introduction

This information note presents a work plan for the Environment Management Group (EMG) for 2022-2023 for approval by the 28th meeting of the EMG Senior Officials. The work plan captures activities planned between November 2022 to October 2023 and has three main expected outcomes which pertain to programmatic, operational and management issues, as well as overall policy dialogue and information exchange. The workplan activities support the implementation of the action points proposed for approval by the Senior Officials and may be complemented following the updating of terms of references for the groups.

The work plan remains un-costed as there is no common budget for EMG activities. The workplan will be implemented subject to the availability of financial resources and in-kind contributions of member entities.
